Starting on the 2nd day of Passover, we count each evening. We count for 49 straight days in a period known as the "Counting of the Omer." Shavuot is over the 50th day.

Our rabbis suggest a meaningful connection between these two holidays. Passover represents freedom. Starting as free men and women, we start marching toward Mount Sinai. 50 days later, we receive Torah. The Torah represents the responsibility of Jewish life that we take. Freedom on one side, responsibility on the other.

On Shavuot (Saturday May 19, 6:00 PM), we will celebrate the giving of Torah along with the confirmation of our two lOth grade students, Sidney Jacobs & Sachio Goodie. Both of these young men have freely chosen to "confirm" their Jewish identities. Sidney & Sachio will participate in the service and there will be several readings from our 9th grade students as well. I hope that you are able to celebrate the giving and receiving of Torah with these two wonderful young men and their families. I'm pleased that Rabbi Gerson will join me on the bima for this special holiday and service.

Israel is a focal part of our Jewish identity. As the poet Yehudah HaLevi wrote, "My heart is in the east while I am in the west." As Jews living outside of Israel, it is our responsibility to think about Israel's place in our hearts.

May 14th marks the 70th anniversary of the first reading of Israel's Declaration of Independence. This Shabbat will be dedicated to our home land of Israel, as we celebrate this anniversary with prayer, song and reflection.

IHNA Host Week—The Host Week takes place May 6-13. Many volunteer slots are being filled by CCI volunteers and those from First Presbyterian, but the May 13 slots, being on Mother's Day, have been a challenge to fill.

The Interfaith Sanctuary Coalition met on April 23 to discuss how to provide various types of assistance to designated needy immigrant families in the community. Interested CCI members will soon have an opportunity to "adopt" an immigrant family or to be a co-buddy to help with various tasks and needs such as providing rides to a physician appointment, offering a meal, helping with translation or checking in with the family.

On another note, Coalition members and supporters successfully appealed to Clarke County Sheriff Ira Edwards to change his practice for handling inmate detainees as coordinated with ICE. In his April 13 press release, "The Sheriff intends to communicate and report immigration status as previously practiced, but [he] will not honor ICE requests to detain persons after criminal charges or other holds are resolved unless such requests are accompanied by a judicial warrant or court order."

In 1906, Abraham Cahan, editor of The Forward, started the Bintel Brief, an advice column for recent Jewish immigrants.

A Havdalah Event: A Staged Reading of The Bintel Brief

Seven members of the congregation will be reading letters originally written in Yiddish by Jewish refugees from 1906 to 1966 and published in the *Jewish Forward*, the newspaper for Yiddish speaking immigrants. In its day the *Forward* had enormous influence over Jewish life, with 275,000 readers at its peak. The letters were published in the



Bintel Brief (Yiddish for "a bundle of letters"), the *Forward's* popular column which offered advice on readers' problems, from the intimate and domestic to business matters. The editor who started the column wanted the column to be "assembled out of those letter that revealed the most interesting nooks of people's souls."

The reading follows the Havdalah service on May 12 at 7pm. It is directed by David Z. Saltz and produced by Lizzie Z. Saltz, with music by Nina Borremans. Participating readers are Jake Berne, Lizz Bernstein, Richard Friedman, Reg McKnight, David Z. Saltz, Havivah Z. Saltz, Lizzie Z. Saltz, Barry Wolk.
